Jim, K6OK and a MLDXCC member, will be doing the engineering for the tower permit process and for my own peace of mind, since the tower will be on the edge of a very steep drop off.

Tube of the Month N6JV

6D22

If you ask a tube collector what he knows about the 6D22, he would probably reply "What is a 6D22"? In my research, I have never found any equipment that actually used one. I found an advertisement in CQ magazine of March, 1946, for the tube so I know about when it was made. In that same CQ issue, another tube, the 4-250A, has an advertisement. Both tubes are high power VHF tetrodes. Perhaps this is a case of a great idea that came out at the worst time. It's



like being the favorite horse in the Kentucky Derby only to run against Secretariat and ending up in a claiming race at Golden Gate Fields. The 4-250A and its beefed up brother, the 4-400A, are still being used today after 70 years. My 6D22 is an orphan but one of the best looking tubes in the museum.

The 6D22 is a beam tetrode made by Raytheon that can deliver a KW up to 60 MHz. I might have made an amplifier with it, but I can't find a spare tube. Popular no, rare yes.

MLDXCC – Outgoing ARRL Bureau

The Mother Lode DX/Contest Club will provide Outgoing QSL Bureau services to current paid club members. The policy is as follows:

The club will cover packaging, shipping, and the \$7.00 ARRL fee. Members will be responsible for the \$1.15 per ounce fee, payable to the club. A scale will be provided at the designated meetings to weigh the cards.

Twice per year, at the March and October meetings, members may bring their outgoing cards (or have delivered by another club member) to the meeting for collection and collating.

All regulations set forth by the ARRL must be met, including:

- Members must be ARRL members to use outgoing bureau.
- Must provide proof of membership (QST mailing label, ARRL membership card)
- Cards need to be sorted according to ARRL requirements when brought to club.

The after-meeting program at those meetings would be dedicated to weighing, merging the

cards, and making sure the paperwork is in order.
