





"How to Count Countries Worked, A New DX Scoring System" by Clinton B. DeSoto, W1CBD, Assistant to the Secretary, ARRL. QST, October, 1935.










- 1. DXCC was a response to an ongoing demand: "How do we count countries?"
- 2. Need to create and use a "standard" list.
- 3. Development of the list began in 1932.
- 4. The number on the list soon exceeded the number of actual countries.
- 5. New countries would appear; existing countries would disappear.
- 6. Basic rule defined: each discrete geographical or political entity is considered to be a country.
- 7. What about island groups?
  - A. Ascension vs Amsterdam, but Maui vs Oahu?
  - B. Tasmania and Australia
- 8. "Countries" are now known as "entities".
- 9. DXAC and ARRL handle new entity requests.

#### **Worked All Zones**




The WAZ Program is one of the longest running in Ham Radio, having its start prior to WWII.

The WAZ program, while it involves the use of "DX Entities", does not rely on any particular "Entity's" status as a country. The WAZ award is geographically focused, which is where it's challenge lies.



## Shucks...It's only 40 Zones not 100 DX Entities







### Not every Zone is equally populated

- Zone 2. Northeastern Zone of North America: VO2 (Labrador), the portion of VE2 Quebec north of the 50th parallel, and Nunavut Territories east of 102 degrees (Includes the islands of King Christian, King William. Prince of Wales, Somerset, Bathurst, Devon, Ellesmere, Baffin and the Melville and Boothia Peninsulas, excluding Akimiski Island, Bear Islands and East Pen Island in Hudson Bay).
- Zone 22. Southern Zone of Asia: A5 (Bhutan), S2 (Bangladesh), VU (India),
   VU (Lakshadweep Is.), 4S (Sri Lanka), 8Q (Maldives.), and 9N (Nepal).
- **Zone 34.** Northeastern Zone of Africa: **ST** (Sudan), **SU** (Egypt), **Z8** (South Sudan) and **5A** (Libya).

NOTE: Single band WAZ awards are by mode.

For example: 20m SSB, 17m CW.

There is no Mixed Mode/Single Band WAZ Award. 5 Band requires a previously earned WAZ Award.








## Perhaps all 40 Zones on one Band-Mode







# **Typical Requirements**

- Need to have the QSLs, but NOT send them in.
- Fees vary from free (sent via email) to over \$50 for some plaques.
- GCR list signed by 2 amateurs.
- IRCs often accepted.



#### Latest trends

- Locations (islands, lighthouses, castles...)
- Short term (big list at dxawards.com)
- Celebrations
- Email certificates in pdf or jpeg formats
- eQSL support (CQ WAZ, WPX, USA-CA, DX)
- LoTW (WPX; possibly others in the future)
